## 2015 BC Aboriginal Business Awards Announced

VANCOUVER – The seventh annual BC Aboriginal Business award recipients were announced today by Premier Christy Clark and Keith Mitchell, Chair of the BC Achievement Foundation, the awards' presenting organization.

The honourees will be celebrated at a gala dinner ceremony on October 14, 2015 at the Hyatt Regency Vancouver where John Rustad, Minister of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation, will present the awards.
